Torah Blessings for an Aliyah

He who is called up for an Aliyah (the *oleh*) recites the following before the reading:

[straighten] [slight bow]
בְּרַכּוּ אֶת יְיָ הַמְּבָרֵךְ.

Bless THE ETERNAL, the blessed One.

Congregation responds:

[straighten] [slight bow]
בְּרוּךְ יְיָ הַמְּבָרֵךְ לְעוֹלָם וָעֶד.

Blessed is THE ETERNAL, the blessed One, for all eternity.

The *oleh* continues:

[straighten] [slight bow]
בְּרוּךְ יְיָ הַמְּבָרֵךְ לְעוֹלָם וָעֶד.

Blessed is THE ETERNAL, the blessed One, for all eternity.

בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם,
אֲשֶׁר בָּחַר בָּנוּ מִכָּל הָעַמִּים וְנָתַן לָנוּ
אֶת תּוֹרָתוֹ. בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Our God, King of the Universe,
Who has chosen us from all peoples and has given us Your
Torah. Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Giver of the Torah.

After the Torah reading, the *oleh* recites the following:

בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם,
אֲשֶׁר נָתַן לָנוּ תּוֹרַת אֱמֶת, וַחַיֵּי עוֹלָם
נִטַּע בְּתוֹכֵנוּ. בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Our God, King of the Universe, Who
has given us the law of truth, and has planted everlasting life in
our midst. Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Giver of the Torah.
