He who is called up for an Aliyah (the *oleh*) recites the following before the reading:

Bless THE ETERNAL, the blessed One.

Congregation responds:

The *oleh* continues:

Blessed is THE ETERNAL, the blessed One, for all eternity.

בְּרוּך אַתָּה יִיָּ אֶ-לֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הְעוֹלְם, אֲשֶׁר בְּחַר בְּנוּ מִכְּל הְעַמִּים וְנְתַן לְנוּ אֶת תּוֹרָתוֹ. בְּרוּך אַתְּה יִיָּ, נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Our God, King of the Universe, Who has chosen us from all peoples and has given us Your Torah. Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Giver of the Torah.

After the Torah reading, the *oleh* recites the following:

בָּרוּך אַתָּה יִיָּ אֶ-לֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר נְתַן לְנוּ תּוֹרַת אֲמֶת, וְחַיֵּי עוֹלָם נְטֵע בְּתוֹכֵנוּ. בָּרוּך אַתָּה יִיָ, נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Our God, King of the Universe, Who has given us the law of truth, and has planted everlasting life in our midst. Blessed are You, O ETERNAL, Giver of the Torah.
